EXPERIENCE

David Wilson is Associate Laboratory Director, National Security Directorate, at the U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) Savannah River National Laboratory (SRNL), operated by Savannah River Nuclear Solutions (SRNS), LLC. In this position he oversees SRNL's efforts in Nuclear Nonproliferation, Global Security, Defense Programs and National Security Studies.

Wilson began his career as a Special Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation in 1987. In 1991, he joined the FBI Laboratory Division, where he qualified as a Forensic Microscopist specializing in the chemical and physical examination of trace evidence. In 1996, he joined the FBI Laboratory's newly formed Hazardous Materials Response Unit and served as its Chief from 1997-2000. Wilson was assigned to the FBI's Washington Field Office and supervised specialized scientific investigative and research efforts in response to biological terrorism. In 2002, he became the Chief of the FBI's newly formed Chemical-Biological Sciences Unit, where he led the development and implementation of a national program for the forensic exploitation of hazardous chemical, biological, and radiological/nuclear materials. From 2006 to 2008 he was detailed to the Department of Homeland Security Domestic Nuclear Detection Office as the Deputy Assistant Director of the National Technical Nuclear Forensics Center, where he led the integration and development of interagency resources and capabilities that enhanced the U.S. Government's nuclear forensics capability. Wilson concluded his FBI career in 2010 as a Senior Executive and Director of the Terrorist Explosive Device Analytical Center.

Wilson joined SRNL in 2010 as the senior weapons of mass destruction advisor.
